communicate with MIDI-equipped instruments. No discs exploit the MIDI interface yet, but its presence enables CD+G discs to play back music on compatible instruments as well as loud-speakers. The interface may also make it possible to delete a particular instrumental part from a CD, so that a MIDI-linked user can play along for real.

JVC's player is not quite the only game in town. Oddly enough, CD+G hunters can also turn to the CD player NEC offers as an option to its new TurboGrafx videogame. The portable deck, designed mainly to play CD-based videogames, has the graphics decoder needed for CD+G discs.

Thanks to this equipment scarcity, acquiring a player is the biggest obstacle to enjoying CD + G. But once this is out of the way, a viewer need simply attach a TV set, switch on the stereo and slip in a disc like the Flamin Groovies' Greatest Grooves compilation. Immediately, the similarity to standard CD playback ends. As the opening bars of the classic "Shake Some Action" surge from the speakers, the screen erupts into a bright cartoon of the album title. Soon, another cartoon appears above real-time graphics of the lyrics. The following number, "Teenage Head," also has lyrics and a cartoon plus quotes from a book about the Groovies. Simple graphics and cartoon figures accompany each of the two dozen cuts on the disc.

One of the charms of CD+G is that each disc is different. Musicians and record companies are experimenting with a variety of approaches. In *Tokyo Rose*, the words to Van Dyke Parks' theatrical tunes mingle with steadily scrolling illustrations. *Naked*, the very first CD+G disc, dispenses with pictures in favor of lyrics, chords and a list of the instruments in use at any given moment. Information Society's eponymous debut disc offers lyrics, cartoons, a lighthearted history of the band, pop quizzes and recording credits.

On The Breathtaking Blue, Berlin's Alphaville trio illustrates its techno-pop approach with a collection of black & white photographs depicting Franz Kafka, dirigibles, the Challenger astronauts,

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
